**Key Indicator 1:** The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer Guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.

**Key Indicator 2:** The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

**Key Indicator 3:** Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

**Key Indicator 4:** Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

**Key Indicator 5:** Increased participation in competitive sport

Curriculum KI1, KI2, KI3, KI4, KI5	£550	In the past year, we have purchased a brand-new PE scheme (Get Set 4 PE), which is a fun, comprehensive programme. Staff have shown an increased confidence in PE and the children are really enjoying the wide range of sports on offer. Their PE journey in St. Gregory's contains a broad range of different sports and activities that may open their eyes to a wider world of sport. We hope that every child finds one sport that they fall in love with and we will encourage them to pursue that passion, even after their time at St. Gregory's is over.
Maintenance KI2, KI4	£10,000	We have upgraded our AstroTurf across two areas of school this year, both in our Nursery area and on the MUGA (pen). This allows more outdoor play, as the AstroTurf is an all-weather surface, whilst also providing a safe place for the children to play sports.
Equipment KI1, KI2, KI3, KI4, KI5	£471.07	In order to deliver PE, we have ensured that we are fully resourced across each topic. We have purchased yoga and tennis equipment, as well

<p>CPD</p> <p>K11, K13, K14</p>	<p>£997</p>	<p>This year saw St. Gregory's begin their Forest School journey, with one member of staff completing an initial Level 3 Practitioner training week. The training is a long-term process that we see increased participation in outdoor activities over the course of the next few years.</p> <p>We have also been accepted as an FA Weetabix Wildcats centre. This centre will see our school welcome girls aged 5-11 from our local area and provide first-class football coaching from our staff and other passionate coaches. Training has been completed by all relevant staff.</p>
<p>Coaching</p> <p>K11, K12, K14, K15</p>	<p>£575</p>	<p>With Covid restrictions in place, we were unable to utilise as many of our wonderful outside agencies this year. We did, however, manage to utilise some coaches, to provide extra-curricular clubs and assist with the coaching and recruitment of sports teams.</p>
<p>Competitions</p> <p>K11, K12, K14, K15</p>	<p>£500</p>	<p>We have continued to support the Chesterfield Sports Competition Programme and the MADCOS Sports Programme, which is organised by our local SSCO. These subscriptions allow us to access sports leagues and competitions throughout the year, for all year groups and covering a wide range of sports.</p> <p>We are passionate about equal opportunities in sports, promoting girls' participation in sport and allowing our younger children to receive a number of opportunities to represent the school.</p>
