<u>Food</u>	<u>School budget</u>	Healthy Eating further developed with Sefton healthy eating programme leaders visiting the school. Educating children with an assembly and occasional pop in visits to monitor the food consumed in both hot dinners and packed lunches.. The school website also provided children and parents with access to NHS healthy eating websites to help provide them with more information and guidance on how to live a healthier lifestyle.
<u>PE</u>	<u>currently</u> <u>£1400</u>	School PE lessons have now been designated to be ran by a qualified teaching assistant and member of the sports team. Assessment/ monitoring programme has been developed to enable the PE teacher to continually assess the children’s strengths and areas for development. Swimming timetable has been reorganised to accommodate SATS and give children the best opportunity to succeed in their tests in May.
<u>School Competitions</u>	<u>currently £850</u>	The school will continue to host the Jubilee Cup, which provides smaller schools an opportunity to win a trophy. The school has signed up to The Chesterfield Sports Competition Programme for the 9 <sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Opportunities for Year 1 and 2 to enter competitions will be pushed this year, alongside developing a school netball team and entering a girl’s football league, giving more opportunities to girls and providing access to different sports.
<u>Clubs</u>	<u>currently</u> <u>£600</u>	Once again the school has invested heavily in sporting opportunities for children both in and out of school hours. Gymnastics and Ninja Warrior coaches will visit the school and run clubs after school and during PE lessons.
